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# SPANISH IMMERSION PROGRAM

Live the full Mexican experience in our innovative Spanish Immersion Program during the summer of 2019. Immerse yourself in the majestic city of Puebla. Be amazed by the colorful city of Oaxaca and the greatness of one of the largest cities in the world, Mexico City. Experience traditional Mexico by discovering the magic of Cuetzalan and the ancient cities of the Pre – Hispanic cultures. Learn Spanish while living with Mexican families and interacting with local and international students. Mexican host students will guide you through all these wonderful experiences, improving your Spanish by leaps and bounds.

Unlike the majority of Spanish immersion programs, this program ties weekly cultural trips directly into academic study. You will be able to choose from three different levels of language courses so that you will have the best opportunity to practice your Spanish. Classes are based on written and spoken texts addressing a variety of themes that will allow students to approach Mexican culture with ease and experience it to the fullest.

Spanish courses are based on the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages (ACTFL) content and proficiency standards. The content standards are the 5 C's: Communication, Cultures, Connections, Comparisons, and Communities. These standards determine what students can do with language. The proficiency guidelines determine how well students demonstrate communicative competency using linguistic skills in three modes of communication: interpretative, interpersonal, and representative. Methodology Course methodology mixes research from Content-Based Instruction (CBI), Styles and Strategies-Based Instruction (SSBI), and constructivist approaches to language learning.

Language tasks are designed to facilitate language acquisition in a meaningful way through problem – solving and projects that promote interaction and the negotiation of meaning in and out of the classroom.

## **The full Mexican experience**

Mexico is a large country with a variety of colors and favors expressed in rich and diverse culture that never ceases to impress visitors to the country. This program makes you feel, see and taste Mexico's deep diversity. This is what we call the full Mexican experience.

Experience colonial Mexico in Puebla while taking classes during the week, visiting cultural sites, and enjoying cultural workshops and integration activities in the afternoon.



Savor the culinary experience with the tasty flavors of Mexican cuisine in the colorful city of Oaxaca. Discover the ancient traditions of pre-Hispanic Mexico in the one of the most well preserved pueblos magicos in the country, Cuetzalan. See how the dancers express their admiration to the Gods with their aerial performances. Explore the caves in the hills and valleys around the town and mingle with the locals in the unique fairs and festivals while they communicate in Mexico's original language, Nahuatl. Wrap up the full Mexican experience by immersing yourself in Mexico City, where the program culminates in to a grand finale of cultural tradition and sophistication.

## Housing with Mexican Families

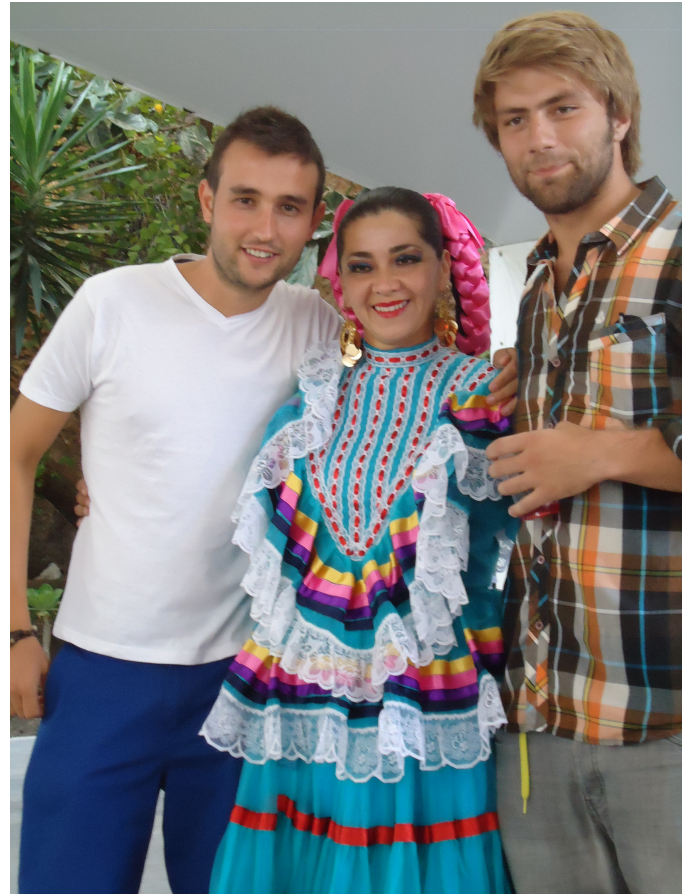
Since the immersion process is a main component of the program, home-stay with Mexican families is your best bet. Mexican families are a great support for stablishing the routine of daily life in the country. Plus, the families provide opportunities for you to achieve your language learning goals and insight into cultural understandings. Host families are located in the surrounding neighborhoods of the university. Public transportation will not take more than 30 minutes to arrive to the university and is a great option for exploring other parts of the city. Your host family will show you how to take public transportation to UPAEP during the first three days of the programs so you will feel comfortable while navigating in your new environment.

### Services include

- Single room with bed linens
  - Study table
- Shared or individual bathroom (depending on the host family)
- Three meals per day included from Monday to Friday
- Breakfast, lunch, and dinner on weekends with host families.

## INTRODUCING PUEBLA

The city of Puebla is located 70 miles southeast of Mexico City, about a two – hour drive from the international airport. Puebla is graced with beautiful weather that averages 77° F year – round. The city has a population of roughly 2 million inhabitants with a metropolitan area of approximately 2.6 million

Friar Toribio de Benavente (better known as Motolini) founded Puebla in 1531 on the slopes of the Popocatepetl and Iztacchiuatl volcanoes, between Veracruz and Mexico City. These epic volcanoes give the city a beautiful and unique landscape that no other Mexican city boasts.

According to Mexican legend, angels laid Puebla's foundation by carefully placing ropes on the city's terrain to outline where the city's main streets and buildings were to be constructed. For this reason, the city is known as Puebla de Los Angeles. Puebla, the fourth largest city in Mexico, is one of the most important and beautiful colonial cities in the country. Its historic downtown impeccably preserves its baroque architecture in its cathedrals, residences, and public buildings, many of which are classified as an UNESCO World Heritage Site. Of all the colonial buildings, the most impressive is the main cathedral. It is said to be the largest in Latin America and is famous for its stunning elegance and beauty. Another popular religious site and an excellent representation of Mexican Baroque is the Rosario Chapel, an elegant chapel covered in gold gilding and known for its finesse. Puebla continues to grow towards a supreme city fostering the perfect blend of culture, nature, tradition, and modernity.
